EARLY SETTLERS

Account furnished by Fred Babcock, Champion St., Marquette, Mich.

Anson Ladd Babcock, grandfather of Fred S., Russell M., Allen A. Babcock and Mrs. Irene Cameron. Anson Babcock came from Niles, Michigan, in or about 1859. He bought and settled on a 20-acre tract of land on what is now Grove St., at the top of the hill, on the south side, east of the present Golf Club.

This land was owned by the family up to 1925 when it was sold to the Specker family, part of the mineral rights being retained, as the land showed a very interesting vein of iron ore.

About 1860, a year later, Anson Babcock's wife and eight children arrived by sailing vessel from ^{Niles, via} the Soo, a long and hard trip in those days. The Grove street property was heavily wooded and was cleared and the wood hauled into Marquette by one of Anson's sons, James, who told a very interesting story of having been in town with a load just before the fire, that destroyed most of Marquette in 1868.

The Babcock family were Baptists and attended the first church built here. I think the services at first were held on Washington street in a building near where St. John's Church now stands. The Baptists moved afterward to a site where later the Fraternity block, (now the Marquette County Historical Society building) stood. Later the present Baptist church was built.
