The following information is desired:

There was one store, where the cormer of Baraga Ave and Front st now intersect. Two frame houses, one behind the present hotel Marquette, the other across from the Store, the south corner of Baraga and Front. Store on North corner of Baraga Ave and Front st. The Indian settlement was located where the old freight house is now, two blocks north of the gas house. The chippewa Indians, Kawbawgam was chief.

Traveled to Negaunee by means of an ore car and a mule over small tracks owned by the Cliff Iron Go., Used also to transport ore to the Marquette dock, the cliff dock. Ore loaded by means of wheelbarrows.

There was a forge located below the city park rock, used for repair purposes, Mr Bernard was employed there.

Cemetery on Ridge and Pine st, also one where the St Peters church now stands. Ist. church of Marquette was on the premises of the burrying ground on Baraga ave and Fourth. Father Gereaux was the

First priest here.
